CHAIRPERSON REPORT

Fellow PPA Members and PharmPAC Supporters,

As we reflect on another impactful year, I am proud of the progress that PharmPAC continues to make on behalf of pharmacists and patients across Pennsylvania. Through your support, PharmPAC remains a strong advocate for fair reimbursement, expanded access to care and policies that strengthen the future of pharmacy.

Our continued focus on bipartisan, pharmacy-centered solutions has allowed us to advance meaningful reform while keeping patient needs front and center. A major priority moving forward is PBM reform that promotes fair and transparent reimbursement practices, including the advancement of a minimum dispensing fee aligned with CMS standards. These efforts are critical to addressing unsustainable payment models that challenge pharmacies across the Commonwealth.

Across the Commonwealth, pharmacies are experiencing increasing challenges. Closures, particularly in rural and underserved communities, are creating “pharmacy deserts,” forcing patients to travel greater distances for essential medications and care. Industry consolidation continues to impact patient access, while reimbursement pressures and supply limitations have directly affected pharmacy services in many regions. These realities reinforce why PharmPAC’s mission is more important than ever.
