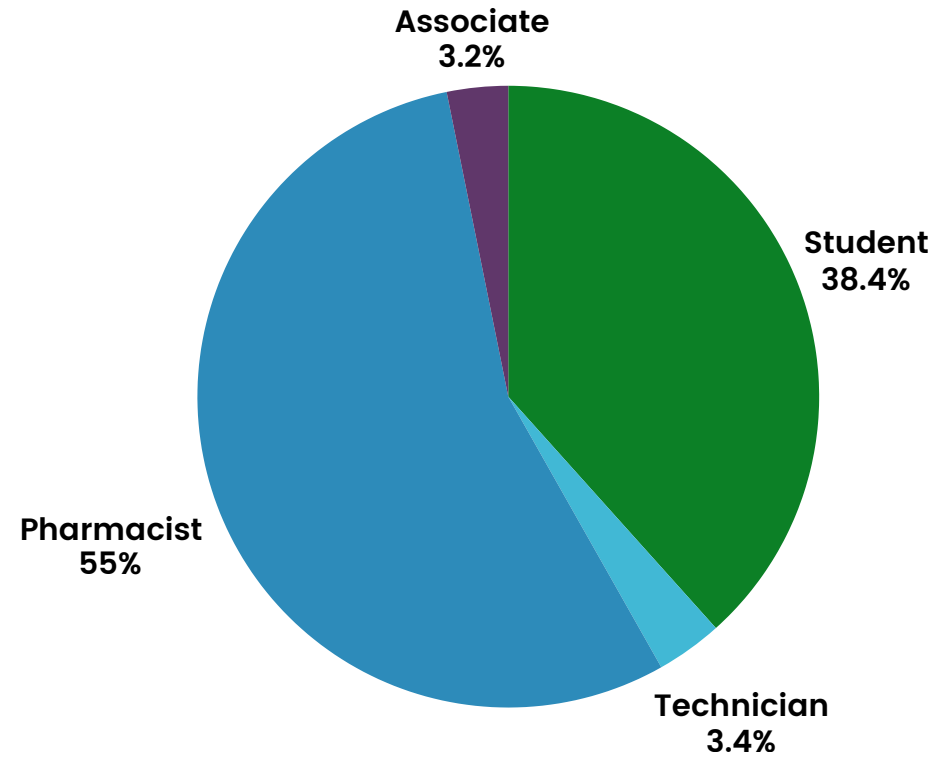

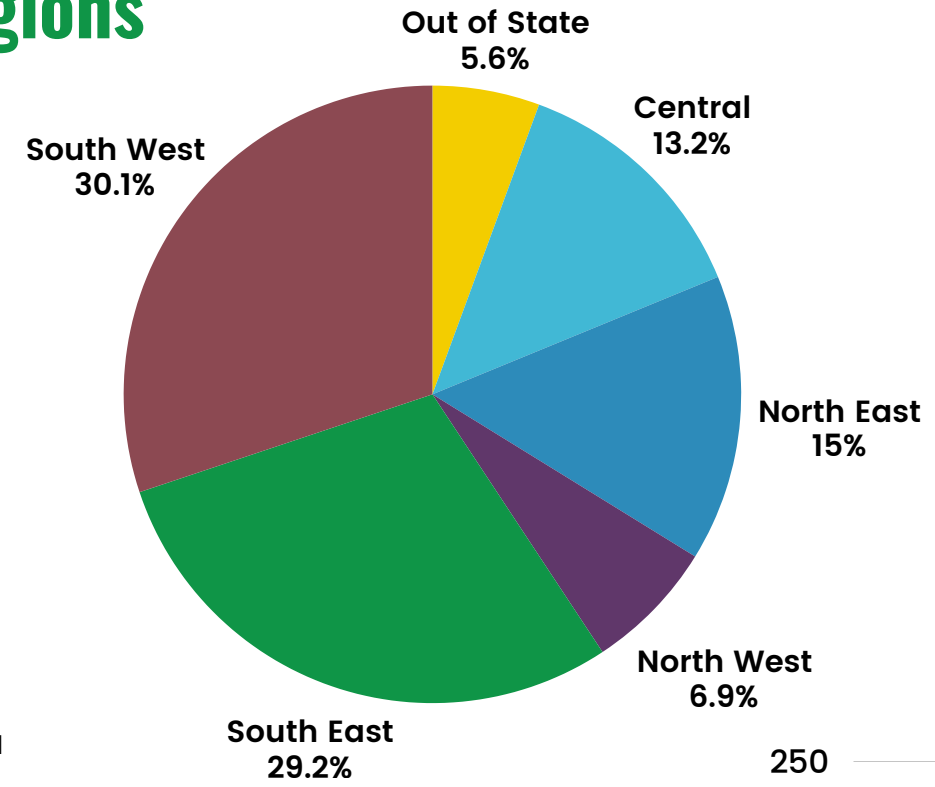


Membership Types

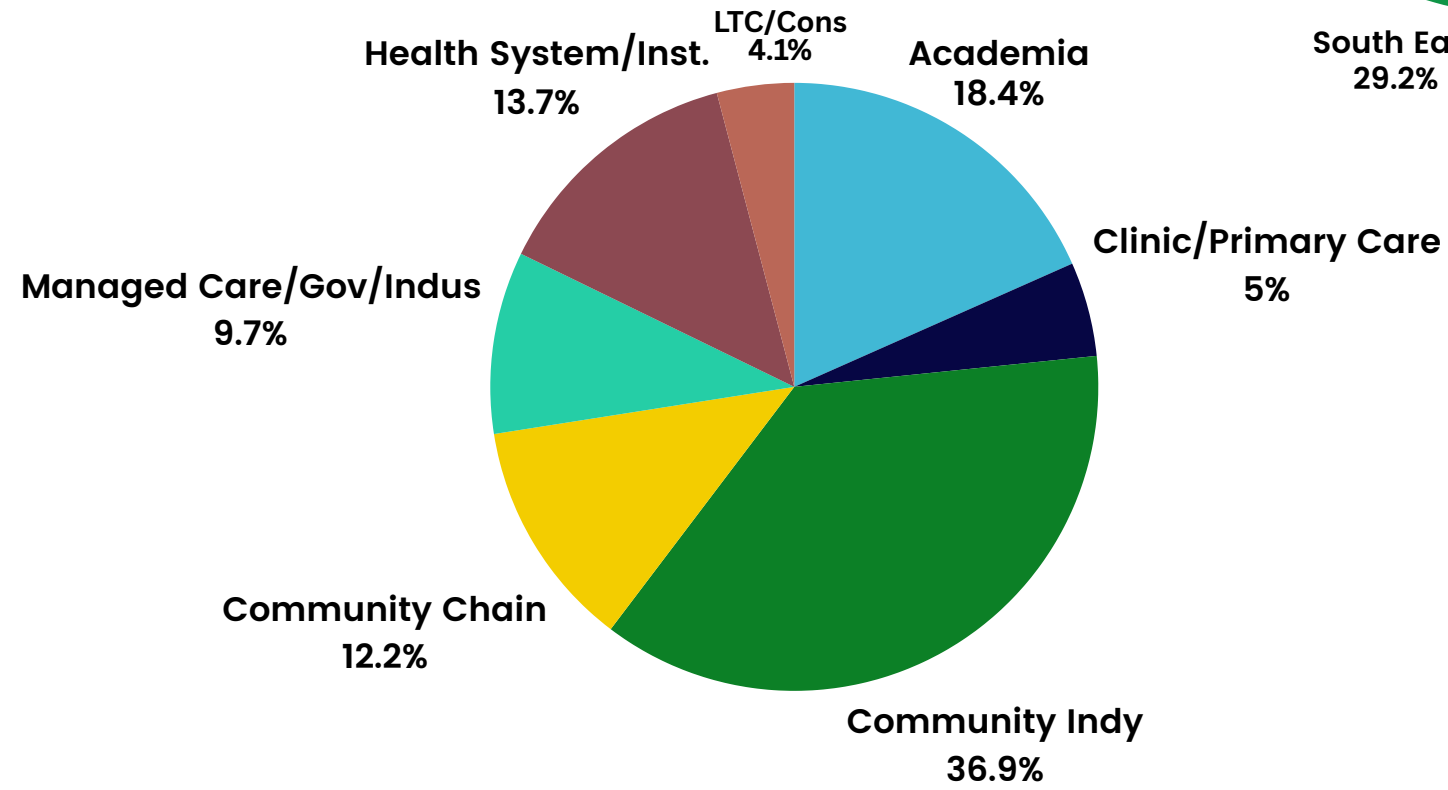

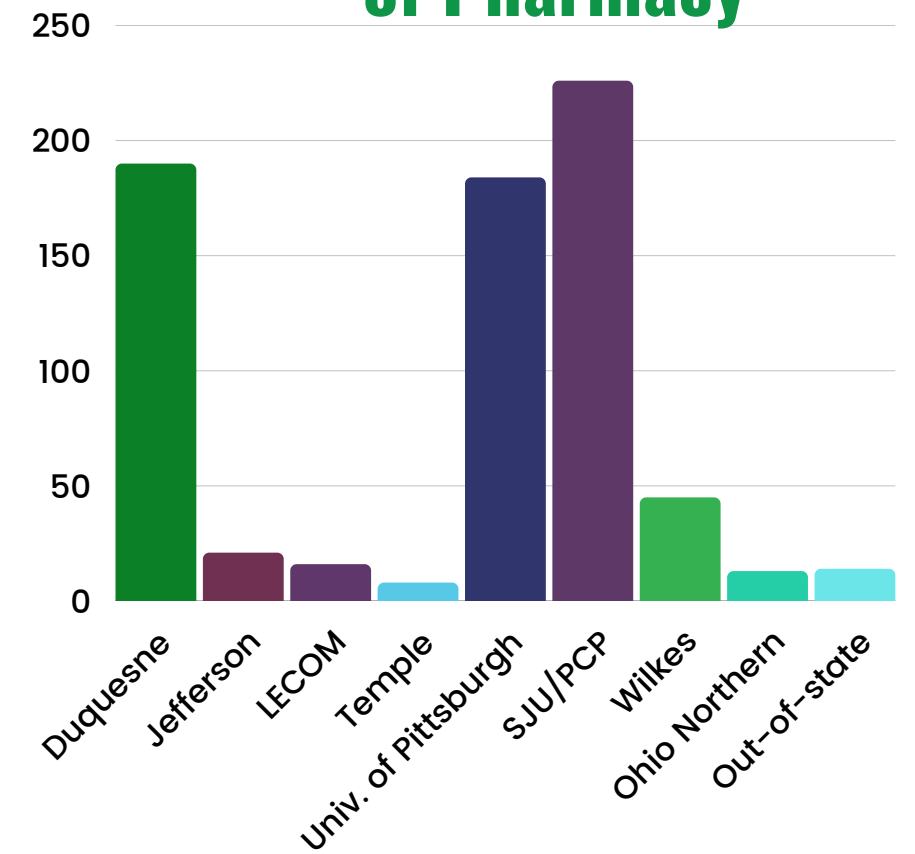

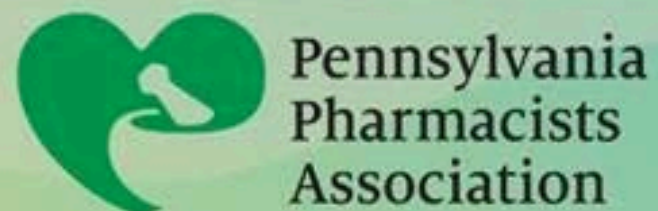


Inaugural Provider Summit

On September 11, pharmacy and healthcare leaders from Pennsylvania and beyond convened for a collaborative one-day summit focused on strengthening pharmacist-provided care in Pennsylvania.

Summit Recommendations

- **Streamline Medicaid Enrollment and Credentialing:** Propose uniform processes and centralized resources to reduce administrative burden.
- **Expand Sustainable Payment Models:** Suggest value-based contracts and tiered reimbursement to support pharmacist-led care.
- **Strengthen Collaborative Care and Integration:** Encourage shared EHR access and structured partnerships with health systems.
- **Advocate for Legislative and Policy Changes:** Recommend provider status recognition and expanded scope of practice for pharmacists.

Advocacy Activities

Protecting Vaccine Access

Pennsylvania's State Board of Pharmacy acts after Governor Shapiro pushes to protect vaccine access across the Commonwealth.

PBM Transparency

Act 77 that increases transparency and accountability of pharmacy benefit managers; bans spread pricing and patient steering; sets guidelines for the contracts between PBMs and pharmacies that protect the pharmacies' interests; and empowers the Pennsylvania Insurance Department to audit PBM contracts.

Medicaid Provider Status

Since Pennsylvania Medicaid recognized pharmacists as mid-level providers in 2024, pharmacists continue to enroll with DHS and once credentialed are eligible to bill for allowable services.





Event Wrap-up

On Monday, April 7, 2025, more than 350 pharmacists and pharmacy students gathered at the Harrisburg State Capitol to celebrate 2025 Pennsylvania Pharmacy Legislative Day. Attendees visited with their lawmakers to discuss important issues facing pharmacy and patients throughout the Commonwealth.

During visits, pharmacists detailed the key accomplishments of Act 77 of 2024, but explained what legislative action is still required to prevent the continuing pharmacy closures. They also provided a Pharmacy Closures fact sheet detailing the critical services pharmacies provide and why continued access to community pharmacies is critical for patient health and welfare.

In the afternoon, PPA held a pharmacy rally and press conference to highlight these issues. PPA President John DeJames kicked off the event by detailing issues facing pharmacy, in particular the predatory practices of many PBMs and the role they play in the continued closure of pharmacies across Pennsylvania.

Special guest speaker and HB 1993 (Act 77 of 2024) co-sponsors, Rep. Jessica Benham and Rep. Valerie Gaydos both addressed the rally and called for more legislation at both the state and federal level. In addition, Rep. Rob Matzie, a Pharmacy Caucus member echoed their comments and called for PA DHS to do more to support pharmacy and prevent pharmacy closures.

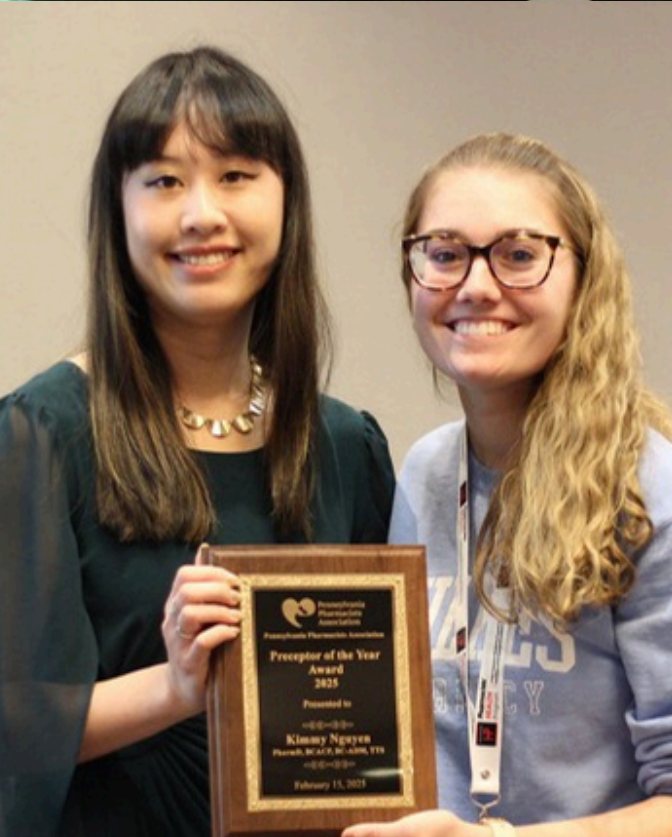
